

# Regarding Premier Ford's COVID protocols announcement on Sept 28th.

Places of worship remain at 30% capacity with 2 meters/6 feet of physical distancing, hand sanitizing, regular cleaning and the Health Unit Orders pertaining to the wearing of face coverings/face masks in place. **Peterborough Public Health Unit**: Workplaces and businesses that are not commercial establishments, public transit, or commercial transportation are not part of the mandatory face covering directive.

On September 26th, Ontario Regulation 364/20 was amended to require workplaces to screen employees and other essential visitors (volunteers) entering the workplace - daily. Our church services remain excluded from these daily screening requirements.

**BE NOT AFRAID:** This year during the COVID-19 pandemic, we cannot gather together physically, but we can still come together virtually to march for life. From a positive perspective, the global response to the



pandemic has centered upon a common affirmation of the value of life..... we are enacting this herculean effort to save lives, especially the elderly, ... Provincial governments, in the effort to save lives, have shut down all non-essential services, but include among "essential services" abortion providers.
