PASSION (PALM) SUNDAY AND HOLY WEEK PREPARATION FOR THE SACRED TIME OF HOLY WEEK, THE TRIDUUM AND EASTER SACRAMENT

OF RECONCILIATION: The only ordinary way of attaining forgiveness for sins is participating in individual and integral confession and absolution. Nevertheless, if a person is unable to make an appointment with a priest for the Sacrament during the current pandemic, it will suffice for the moment to pray the Act of Contrition as best as one can intending it truthfully, and to commit to participating in the Sacrament of Reconciliation as soon as possible when conditions allow. There will be no permission granted for General Absolution.

WHAT IS HOLY WEEK AND WHAT HAPPENS DURING THIS TIME? The final week of preparation before Easter Sunday, these days recount Christ's final days on earth. Traditionally on the Monday of Holy Week, the priests of the Diocese of Peterborough gather for the Mass of Chrism held at St. Peter In Chains Cathedral.

WHAT IS PALM SUNDAY? Also called Passion Sunday, it is the Sunday before Easter. Palms are distributed as a reminder of Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem. In 2021, Palm Sunday falls on March 28th.

NEEDS OF THE CHURCH IN THE HOLY LAND COLLECTION ON GOOD

FRIDAY Each year on Good Friday, our parish is called to support Christians in the Holy Land. Many Christians in the Holy Land depend on the collection for their lives. As a Pontifical collection requested by Pope Francis, the annual Good Friday Collection helps to maintain not only the Holy Places above all, but also the pastoral, welfare, educational and social works that the Church carries out to the benefit of the Christian brothers and sisters and the local population.
