Pastor's Easter Message

Dear Parishioners,

"Do not be afraid" is a message of hope in the midst of a pandemic, and it is the first message of Easter, spoken by an angel to the first witnesses of Jesus' resurrection. The months of March 2020 to April 2021 have been historic in the midst of the spread of COVID-19. With great joy in my heart, I announce to you: Happy Easter! Do not be afraid! "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!" This ancient greeting sums up what we celebrate this Easter Sunday, the joy of Christ risen and alive in our midst.

"This is the day the Lord has made: let us rejoice and be glad" (Psalm 118). Christ by his death and resurrection has conquered sin so we may live. The Resurrection is the foundation and cornerstone of our faith. As St. Paul says, if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is useless, and our faith too is in vain (Cf. 1 Cor 15:14).
