

MESSAGES FROM Fr. RANDY

Let us remember During November we will remember our faithful departed. By the statue of St. Patrick candles, I will have a basket there and at any time throughout November you are welcome to write down on piece of paper name(s) you wish to remember during this month at mass.

One of the most sublime of the spiritual works of mercy is to pray for the dead, especially our deceased loved ones and family members. The Church invites us every year to intensify that act of charity during the month of November. We pray for those who lived, to our eyes, a good and holy life. We also pray for those who seemed to live a life far from God, his sacraments, and his commandments. We pray for them all, entrusting them to God's mercy, knowing that in the communion of saints, our prayers and good deeds are efficacious.

We pray for the deceased because we realize that each one of us at death hangs on to something of this earthly life and may not be quite prepared for heaven or ready to accept and receive the fullness of God's love. It is in purgatory that we are purified and cleansed of our imperfections so that we can join the company of saints and enjoy eternally that place where every tear is wiped away. The following words of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI are very helpful and consoling: "I would go so far as to say that if there was no purgatory, then we would have to invent it, for who would dare say of himself that he was able to stand directly before God ...

Purgatory basically means that God can put the pieces back together again. That he can cleanse us in such a way that we are able to be with him and can stand in the fullness of life." Purgatory, therefore, is a great mercy.

Both the Old and New Testaments provide us with examples of praying for the dead. I present you with a few examples:

1. General Judas Maccabbe takes up a collection so that prayers would be said in the Temple for his soldiers killed in battle, in reparation for their sins (2 Macc. 12:39-45)

- 2. Praying to Saints: The Rich Man and Lazarus (Luke 16:24-28)
- 3. Saul Petitions the Prophet Samuel After the Latter's Death (1 Sam 28:15-19, Jer 15:1)
- 4. The Apostle Paul Prayed for the Dead (2 Tim 1:16-18) Therefore, praying for the deceased is a longstanding obligatory practice of our Catholic faith Let us remember to pray this month for all those who have died. We pray with faith together as a family; we pray with hope that we will see our loved ones again; and we pray with charity for those for whom there is no one to pray. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord; And let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.




NEW OPTION FOR MASS
