Wednesday Feb. 2 is the Presentation of the Lord. Traditionally candles are blessed for one to use in their homes. I will be happy to bless any candles for your home after mass -just bring your candles to mass on Wednesday morning. There will be some candles available for a donation \$2 ( box of two small candles|) and \$10 for a St. Joseph Candle. (Limited supplies).

Blessing of Throats in honor of St. Blaise (Feast Day



Feb. 2), physician, and healer, I will be blessing throats following Thursday morning mass and on the weekend after each Mass. While we invoke St. Blaise for his

protection against any physical ailment of the throat, we should also ask his protection against any spiritual ailment - profanity, cursing, unkind remarks, detraction, or gossip. St. James reminds us, "If a man who does not control his tongue imagines that he is devout, he is selfdeceived; his worship is pointless" (1:26) Therefore, may St. Blaise protect us from all evil, physical, and spiritual, which may attack the throat.
