

One Word at a Time **RESENT**

How do we oppose the mercy of God? Certainly, that happens when we refuse to accept or share mercy. More subtly and perhaps more dangerously, it happens when we resent the forgiveness and the second chance that others receive. In doing so, we align ourselves with death, not new life. "But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found." (Luke 15:32

THE HOLY EUCHARIST: DID YOU KNOW?

Imitate the saints! This is an invitation to each of us. It was emphasized in the teaching of Vatican II. We are each called to become a saint. Father Lukas Etlin explains in his booklet, "The Holy Eucharist Our All", that we accomplish this by nourishing a great devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. By placing all of our cares, hopes and fears before Our Lord, we grow in our love for Him and for each other.

Reflection: Our social relationships need personal interactions in order to grow and blossom.
