

EASTER TRIDUUM is a term used by the Roman Catholic Church to denote the three days from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. The Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper and ends after evening prayers at sunset on Easter Day.

Also in Roman Catholicism, images of saints are either kept or veiled until the Easter Vigil. Votive lights before these images are not lit. Crucifixes that are movable are hidden, while those that are not movable are veiled until the Easter Vigil.

THE HOLY EUCHARIST: DID YOU KNOW?

"What is it, Lord, that You could have done for us, that You have not done?" (St. Bridget of Sweden) The Holy Eucharist is the greatest Sacrament of all because it is truly Jesus' present to us in the consecrated Host. Jesus nourishes us with His very own Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. He pours out His love, mercy, and innumerable graces each time we worthily receive Him in Holy Communion.

Reflection: It is supremely important to receive the Blessed Sacrament. How can we afford to neglect the Holy Eucharist when Christ enriches our souls, nourishes, and strengthens us and prepares us for an eternity of joy with the Blessed Trinity in Heaven?



SHARE LENT- DEVELOPMENT & PEACE

Standing up to corporate power in Honduras the People and Planet First campaign is about helping communities stand up to corporate power. In Honduras, as in much of the Global South, corporations often threaten and criminalize activists who speak up against their abuses. The Lenca Indigenous leader Víctor Vásquez was imprisoned for fighting the corporate takeover of his people's ancestral territory. Development and Peace's partner, the Honduran Centre for the Promotion of Community Development (CEHPRODEC), helped free him from jail. Another partner, Caritas Choluteca, trains and accompanies community leaders in advocating for policies that respect human rights and the environment. Recently, they got mayoral election candidates to undertake to declare the municipality of Otoconia mining-free zone if elected.
