

## **MESSAGES FROM Fr. RANDY:**

**Dear Friends in Christ,** 

**The Holy Eucharist:** *DID YOU KNOW?* 

The month of July is dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. Did you know that the Blessed Sacrament contains the whole Christ? i.e. The Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus, the Second Person of the Blessed

St. Josemaria Escriva wrote, "There is not a single soul in whom Christ is not interested. Each soul has cost Him the price of His Blood."

**Reflection:** When you receive Holy Communion you are being washed in the Blood of Christ. You have been purchased at such a great price: the Blood of Jesus. With how much humility, gratitude, adoration and thanksgiving should you appreciate this great sacrifice of Christ, which He has made for love of you?

Do take the time to reflect upon this powerful gift of grace after you receive the Blessed Sacrament today.

#### **Curiosity Corner**

## Q: Why do we have a liturgical season called ordinary time? Can you explain?

A: Ordinary time is the longest season of the liturgical year. It begins the Monday after January 6, the Epiphany, and goes until the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. That period can last anywhere from five to eight weeks, depending on when Easter is celebrated. Ordinary time picks up again the

Monday after Pentecost Sunday and lasts from twenty-three to twenty-seven weeks, until the end of the liturgical year, the Saturday before Advent begins.

Why the name ordinary? "Ordinary" is not in contrast to "extraordinary" or "special" but rather stresses the Latin language notion of "ordinal" or numbered Sundays. The Latin title for the season, tempus ordinarium, conveys the sense that this time of the year is measured or numbered time. Measured time can allude simply to the numbered Sundays, or the notion that these Sundays are a "measured" time to deepen and immerse ourselves completely in the realities of Jesus' incarnation, ministry, passion, death, and resurrection. Ordinary time offers us the opportunity to connect the ordinary lived experiences of our lives with those of Jesus, who modeled for us how to live a truly human existence.

enthusiasm. Children learn liturgical behavior by copying you.

If your child becomes really uncomfortable and needs a break, feel free to leave Mass and walk around, but please come back. It's ok! It's all part of being a parish family.

#### TO THE MEMBERS OF THE PARISH:

Remember that the way we welcome children in Church directly affects the way they respond to the Church, to God and to one another.

Let them know that they are loved and appreciated in this house of worship. A smile of **encouragement** is always welcome to parents with small, active children.
