

**PLANNING** will be prayed on the First Weekend and last Weekend after communion. There are prayer cards at the back of the church. We begin in October.



#### THE HOLY EUCHARIST: DID YOU KNOW? This

week's theme: The Importance of Receiving Holy Communion There are two different saints quoted here this week. St. Teresa of Calcutta taught, "We must not separate ourselves from The Eucharist. The moment we do so, something shatters." St. John Vianney penned, "Not to go to Communion is like someone dying of thirst beside a spring." Reflection: Both saints are emphasizing the tremendous value of the worthy reception of Jesus in Holy Communion. What is "shattering" is the precious, loving bond of grace between us and our Loving God. We spiritually die by choosing to live apart from God, when we chose serious sin.
