This week's theme: Prayer and Faith in the Holy Eucharist

Jesus exhorts us in the Gospel this week not to lose Faith and to continue to pray always. (Luke 18:1-8). Our Lord closes this parable of the widow and the unjust judge with the words, "And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on earth?" Such a sad statement!

Reflection: The Mass is the most intense encounter between us and Our Lord that is possible this side of heaven. Some have never developed a personal relationship with Christ. To do this, prayer is needed. How important is prayer to you? St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta said, "Love to pray. Prayer enlarges the heart until it is capable of containing God's gift of Himself."

PRAYER CORNER

What is prayer? Prayer is the lifting up of our minds and hearts to God.

Why do we pray? First, to adore God, expressing to Him our love and loyalty.

Second, to thank Him for His favors.

Third, to obtain from Him pardon for our sins.

Fourth, to ask for graces and blessings for ourselves and others.

How should we pray? First, with attention. Second, with a conviction of our own helplessness and dependence on God.

Third, with a great desire for the graces we ask of Him.

Fourth, with loving trust in His goodness. Fifth, with perseverance.
