

WE REMEMBER OUR BELOVED DEAD

Dear friends, We are people of hope. Every time we recite the Creed, we say "I believe in the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come." The seed of eternity has been planted in our hearts, and it grows within us in the form of desires for that which endures and lasts forever. Even death, as scary and painful as it is, cannot take away from us the gift of eternal life that Christ promised to those who believe in him.

This month of November, before the season of Advent begins, the readings at Mass will lead us to think of that final and definitive encounter with Christ, an encounter that we anticipate with hope. I often think of those encounters that I have had with people, friends, family members, that I wish never ended. Such will be our final encounter with Christ like, one that we hope never ends and that, in fact, will never end.

I hope that we are able to cultivate in our lives those moments, those encounters that have a flavor of eternity. They are a statement of faith in the life of the world to come, a life that is already found in the world that we live in for, as we say at Mass, "heaven and earth are full of God's glory."
