
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



Third Sunday of Advent. To our visitors, you may have come as a stranger to us, yet you are known to Our Lord, Jesus Christ. In His name, we pray you will find peace, hospitality, and friendship with us.

No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, we are glad you're here and hope that you come back again. The doors of our parish and our hearts are open to you. Please be in touch.

Holy Eucharist – Did you know? This week's theme: **Doubt** In today's Gospel John the Baptist has his doubts about Jesus. He sends his disciples to ask Our Lord, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?"

Reflection: Do you doubt the real, substantial Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament? In humility ask Our Lord today after you receive Him in Holy Communion to reveal His loving Presence to you. Do you doubt His love for you, as you gaze upon the crucifix? Do you doubt His desire to come to dwell in the very depths of your heart, as you approach Him in the Holy Eucharist?

<u>Please note:</u> I will begin to hear confessions Sunday morning from 9a.m. -9:30 a.m. as well as Saturday 4p.m. -4:30 a.m. help prepare you for the Christmas season.

On Dec 21 from 9a.m till 7p.m. all day confession at St. Alphonsus. During the day there will be different priests present to hear confessions. (This will be the last chance before the celebration of Christmas within the city area).

We begin the Third Week in Advent rejoicing! We light the pink candle to remind us that the birth of Christ is soon to be celebrated and all the promises made of old will once again be fulfilled. The prophet Isaiah fills us with reasons to rejoice at the coming of the Savior. The Israelites had been wandering in the desert and waiting for that promise to be fulfilled. You can feel that excitement almost jumping off the pages of Scripture: The desert and parched land will exult. They will bloom with abundant flowers and rejoice with joyful song. Strengthen the hands that are feeble, make firm the knees that are weak. Say to those whose hearts are frightened Be strong, fear not! Here is your God...he comes to save you! Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared. Then will the lame leap like a stag, then the tongue of the mute will sing.

For those who suffer or feel abandoned or lost or confused or saddened, these are the words we need to hear to lift us from our darkness to the light and joy of God's love. James in our second reading calls us to this Advent with the words: "Be patient until the coming of the Lord. Make your hearts firm, because the coming of the Lord is at hand." We need to heed these words as we prepare ourselves for Christmas. This Advent season is a gift to us from the Lord. It calls us to all the things we want the most in life: peace, joy, hope and love. We are given these days to ask ourselves how we can bring these to our lives and to those around us. Open your ears and hear His promise, walk firmly in the path that Christ has set for us and open your eyes to the beauty of God's love that surrounds us. Those promises will become more and more real if we do!

PREPARING FOR CHRISTMAS AFTER THE LOSS OF A LOVED ONE

Such a loss! Such a keen and tearing pain. Even when I am in a crowded room, there is a loneliness I never knew existed. Comforting God, I have turned to you so many times for solace, and I come again. While the world is bright and sparkling, my heart feels leaden and has an emptiness that cannot be filled.

Lord, how can I enter into this season of joy? In my head I celebrate your birth into this world, but in my everyday life, I am filled with a grief that runs so very deep. You blessed me with a loving relationship and now it is gone from my life. How can I be faithful to that love and the memory of that love and my sorrow in this season of "Rejoice!"??

Tears are so close to the surface all the time and helpful friends who want to "keep me busy" don't seem to really understand that I need to embrace my grief. I am afraid of letting go of the sadness and losing the deep love connection I had.

Instead of entering into the Rejoice of Christmas, I long for the sorrow of Lent. I beg you Lord, show me how the two are connected. I ponder the name *Emmanuel* and know that it means "God with us." With us. With me in this world, in this sorrow. If I look beyond my pain, I know that you, too, suffered so much in this world. I never understood so clearly before that Emmanuel is what your nativity is really about. You are in my world, in my pain.

Thank you, Lord, for the loved one you blessed my life with. Grant me now in my grief, a peace. Give me a comfort that might not make the tears go away, but that lets me feel your presence as you take up a place deep in my heart, with me.
