
#### PRAY THE ROSARY AT HOME FOR YOUR FOLLOWING PARISHIONERS:

#### <u>New Year blessing for your home on this day of Feast</u> <u>of the Epiphany:</u>

As the Wise Men brought Him gifts, bring Him the gift of your heart and as they rejoiced in finding Him, rejoice in His Presence to you in Holy Communion. Today we celebrate the visit of the Wise Men to Baby Jesus. The word "epiphany" means revelation or manifestation, and the arrival of these visitors from another land is taken to represent the way that Christ is revealed to the wider world, beyond the Jewish community of one particular time and place. Jesus was a gift meant for the whole world! In Catholic tradition, Epiphany is a time to bless your home for the year. This is a great family activity – Children love blessing things, and they'll find writing with chalk on your doorframe pretty exciting, especially if you lift them up to do it themselves. Just make sure that you explain to them what you are doing and why! The blessing is traditionally inscribed on the doorway above the main entry to your house. After praying a prayer of blessing (see below), use the chalk to write this above the door:

20 † C † M † B † 23

The numbers on the ends represent the current year, with the letters in the middle representing the names of the three wise men. (They are not named in the Scriptures, but tradition calls them Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar.) "CMB" also stands for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat," a Latin phrase that means, "May Christ Bless This House." Crosses, representing Jesus' present

in our home and in our hearts, are drawn to separate the letters.
