





Holy Eucharist: Did you know?

This week's theme: In the Beginning was the Word

This Sunday we celebrate a relatively new Feast: The Sunday of the Word of God. The emphasis is on celebrating the sacred Scriptures. Recall that the words of Scripture are the words of Jesus. When we spend time with the words of Scripture, we are also spending time with Jesus, who is the Incarnate Word of God.

Ignorance of the Scripture is ignorance of Christ.

Reflection: St. Jerome wrote, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." Let us not be ignorant of Jesus by not recognizing

Him in both the Sacred Scriptures and in the reality of His Divine Prescence in the Holy Eucharist. In the Scriptures Christ is there to teach us in His words. In the Eucharist He is there Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity to nourish and sanctify us.

Reflection Questions for the Week

Do I value all human life, from womb to tomb? Am I aware of how much God loves all people, including the unborn, the homeless, the aged, the prisoner, the migrant, and all of those who are looked down upon by others?

What can I do today to affirm the dignity of another person?


BRINGING SCRIPTURE TO LIFE - with Munroe Scott. I am looking forward to gathering again with you on the first Wednesday of February. The study will be
