



**GREETINGS FRIENDS**, Easter is fast approaching. In a little less than a month, we will be celebrating that Jesus Christ conquered death by his Passion, Death and Resurrection. Ever since that first Easter day, those who believe in Christ (us!) have access to life in abundance, on this earth and into eternity!

I have been moved by the effort that many of you show in living out these forty days of Lent with fervor and commitment. My hope is that, come Easter, we can put as much effort into celebrating the fifty days that make up the Easter season. The life of the Risen Christ, a life that He does not keep to himself but that He shares with each one of us through the Sacraments and prayer, is truly worth celebrating!

During this penitential season of Lent, we have two major celebrations, or solemnities, that give us a taste of the joy that is to come at Easter, namely, the solemnity of St Joseph on March 20 and the solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord on March 25.

As we continue living out this season of Lent, I also invite us to think ahead and to begin planning ways in which we will commit to celebrate the resurrection of the Lord for fifty days (the Easter season) to show that, in the end, with Christ as our Friend and Savior, "All shall be well!" #### This week's theme: Thirst

The focus in today's gospel is on the Samaritan woman at the well. (John 4: 5-42) We find Jesus asking the Samaritan woman to give Him a drink of water. As the story progresses Jesus has the occasion to say to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying this to you, ...you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water. Whoever drinks the water that I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." **<u>Reflection</u>**: This "living water" is a share in the Divine Life of the Blessed Trinity i.e., Grace. We are never more fully alive than when we are in the state of grace and sharing in the eternal life of the Trinity. When we receive Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, He quenches our thirst by filling us with sanctifying grace. If we are not in the state of grace because of mortal (serious) sin, we should not receive Holy Communion until we have received the sacrament of Penance (confession). Lent is the perfect time to return to this

sacrament of peace and reconciliation. If you've been away from the Church, consider a return. Peace and grace will flood your soul with joy.

Lenten Fasting and Mercy "Fasting bears no fruit unless it is watered by mercy...When you fast, if your mercy is thin, your harvest will be thin; when you fast, what you pour out in mercy overflows into your barn. Therefore, do not lose by saving, but gather in by scattering. Give to the poor, and you give to yourself. You will not be allowed to keep what you have refused to give to others." St. Peter Chrysologus.
