

The Kingdom of God is like ...

The one central message for Jesus was the Kingdom of God/Heaven, appearing no less than 53 times, most often in the form of a parable. The parable is a **short fictional story** that speaks on a religious attitude or moral belief. These stories are succinct, using few characters, and are generally focused on one specific lesson they want to teach or moral they want to promote. Parables use literary devices such as similes, metaphors, and symbolism in order to convey their meaning. They do not hand you the meaning, but are meant to draw you in, inviting one to ponder what is being

Perhaps the reason he chooses to use parables when attempting to teach about the kingdom of God, was because the people already had in mind what the kingdom of God looked like and how it ought to function. They understood this kingdom to be like any other kingdom on earth, with one difference: they would now hold all the power, never oppressed by another ever again, and their enemies would answer to them. They would of course have a mighty and powerful ruler, that none of their enemies could withstand. It was their time, that would never come to an end, to rule over all others. Jesus, however, had a very different view on this.

Not once, through his use of parables about the kingdom of God, does he speak about subjecting others to a military power and regime. In fact, he does not speak about ruling over others in any form. He does not demand peoples unwavering loyalty and support to him through conformity or uniformity. On the contrary, he will through the parables, invite people to become critical thinkers. To investigate the deeper meaning of his parables, and then consider the implications of what he is suggesting. Basically, Jesus was giving us a glimpse of the nature and being of God, and how we could potentially allow this awareness to inform our thoughts, words and actions. Often when the people grasped what Jesus was suggesting, most of them walked away from him and never looked back. While the few who wrestled with this new wisdom and vision, were changed beyond imagination and description. It is about reading the parables through the lens of the soul.


